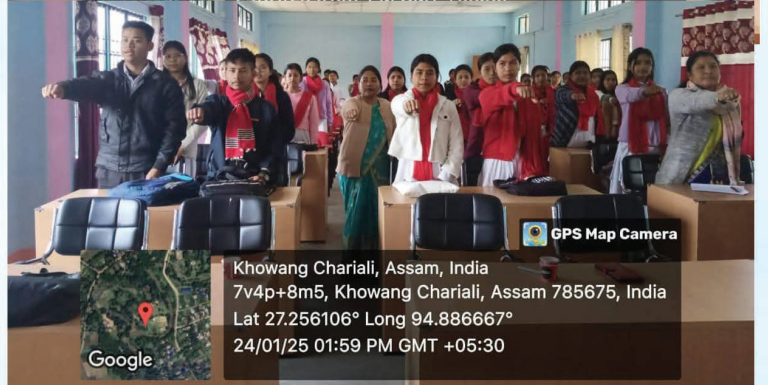

Awareness Programme on Electoral Participation in upcoming Panchayat Election 2025



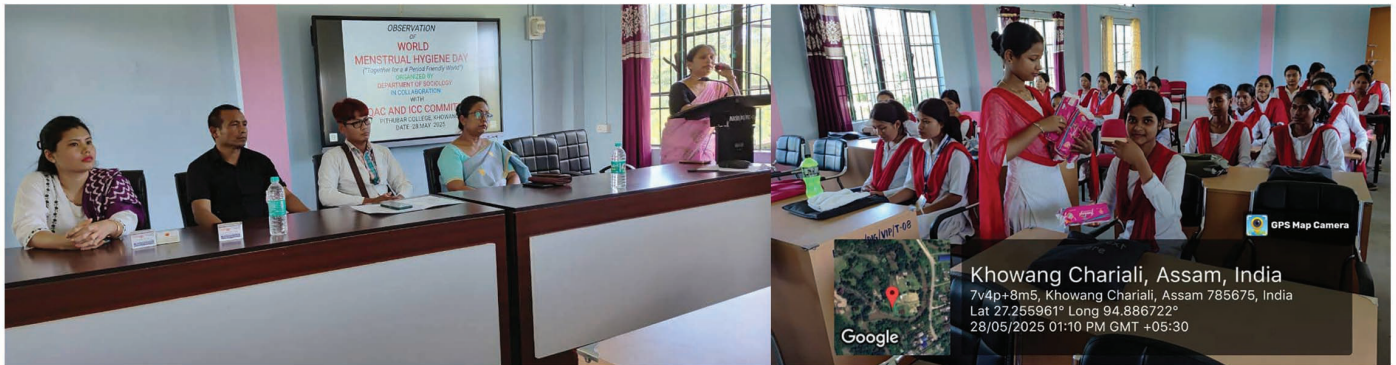

The workshop commenced with a welcome address by the Coordinator of IQAC, Pithubar College, who highlighted the relevance and urgency of understanding the evolving paradigms in the NAAC assessment and accreditation process. The Principal of Pithubar College delivered the inaugural speech, emphasizing the significance of such academic collaborations in fostering a

culture of continuous improvement and accountability in higher education institutions. Two distinguished resource persons, Dr. Lekhan Gogoi, Director, Centre for Distance and Online Education, Dibrugarh University and Mr. Hari Prasad Kaphley, Associate Professor, Department of English, Moridhal College, Dhemaji graced the workshop and shared their expertise with the participants. Dr. Lekhan Gogoi who was the Coordinator of IQAC Moridhal College delivered a comprehensive presentation on the revised Assessment and Accreditation (A&A) methodology adopted by NAAC. He discussed the key changes introduced in the new framework, such as data validation and verification (DVV), Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS), the role of ICT in documentation, and the importance of outcome-based education (OBE) in the accreditation process. Mr. Hari Pd Kaphley, Who as the Joint Coordinator, IQAC, Moridhal College practitioner, focused on the practical aspects of preparing for NAAC peer team visits, aligning institutional practices with the seven criteria of NAAC, and using institutional data effectively for self-study reports (SSR). The workshop witnessed active participation from faculty members, administrative staff, and IQAC representatives from both Pithubar College and Moran Commerce College. The event concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by a representative of IQAC, Moran Commerce College.

The resource person for the program was Dr. Diganta Gogoi, Associate Professor (Retd.), Department of Assamese, HGDG College, Nitaipukhuri. Dr. Gogoi, an expert in the field of indigenous knowledge systems and sustainable livelihoods, shared valuable insights into the scope, techniques, and market prospects of vanilla cultivation in Assam. His address highlighted how such ventures could empower rural youth and promote agri-based entrepreneurship. On the same occasion, the first issue of the Newsletter of the Department of Assamese was formally inaugurated by the Principal of Pithubar College, marking a significant milestone for the department. 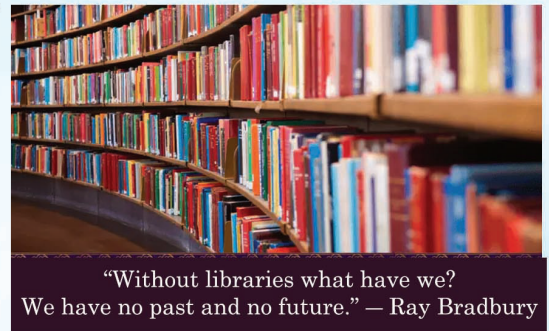
Participation in Combined Annual Training Camp-07
